

### We Asked Mighties About Coronavirus: 78% Believe Not Enough Testing Is Being Done

It now dominates our lives: What happens next with the coronavirus? How do we keep each other safe as the world confronts an historic health crisis?

The Mighty, the largest digital healthcare community, exists to connect us in our health journeys. Some of us live with rare conditions. Many battle the everyday challenges of chronic illness. Others are simply trying to remain healthy and care for others. The coronavirus is unique in that it impacts all of us, whether we're at risk or not.

Given the gravity of the moment, we checked in with Mighties, to see how they feel about the coronavirus, how they're affected and what they want to know. From March 10 to March 12, we ran a survey, and 8,264 members of our community spent 10 minutes sharing their understanding, concerns and experiences with the coronavirus.



## 64% feel differently about the coronavirus now




# 69% of US respondents are worried about the current situation with coronavirus

# Response

# On a scale of 1–5, where 1 is not satisfied at all with the government response to the virus, and 5 is extremely satisfied:

US respondents averaged 2.34, with 34% of respondents saying they were "not satisfied at all".

- Men averaged 2.42
- Urban dwellers averaged 2.12 while rural people averaged 2.48

believed too much had been done to provide updates to the public



### Methodology

- 10 minute survey around awareness, perceptions, and experience with the coronavirus (COVID-19)
- Total of 8,264 global respondents
- Fielded from March 10, 2020 March 12, 2020
